Represented the receiver appointed for the Stanford Financial Group entities in SEC fraud case arising from \$8 billion Ponzi scheme.

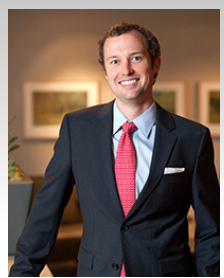
